I enjoyed the show until someone walked up to my XKE and pointed out I had a flat tire. I was surprised to see my front passenger's side tire had a large silver screw stuck in it. I was "screwed" so to speak. I thought briefly about trying to change the tire and put the spare on, but wasn't sure I could do it since I had never changed a tire on my E-Type. One of the downsides to having wire wheels is that you have to have inner tubes, which means repair kits like run-flat won't fix a flat.

I decided that the most prudent course of action would be to call for a tow, so I called Hagerty (I'm a Driver's Club member). As an aside, I used to have Triple A towing, but they dropped me for "overuse" of their towing services. I finally got through to Hagerty and scheduled a tow. After many text messages, Hagerty called to inform me that no tow truck driver was available until Monday. My only alternative was to change the tire and hope the spare had air.

Fortunately, some Club members knew a guy from the Triumph Club who had changed many tires on E-Types. We pulled the spare out of the boot and found it had air. After jacking up the passenger side, the Triumph Club guy whacked off the knock off hubs with my lead hammer. You might think one

would use a rubber mallet so as not to scratch the chrome on the knock offs, but that tool is probably too soft to loosen the knock offs. Once the knock offs were removed, the flat tire could be pulled off and then replaced with my spare. The car was lowered to the ground and voila the job was done. Two things to watch out for. First, make sure the jack is position correctly under the frame before attempting to lift the car. And second, pay close attention to the engraving on the knockoffs as to whether you need to turn them clockwise or counterclockwise. In the U.S. just about everything is clockwise to tighten and counterclockwise to loosen (rightsy tightsy; lefty loosey). I hope someone will write a future column for newsletter

explaining why the British don't follow the standard rules for spinning off knockoffs. The British aren't even consistent; I think it's clockwise for the passenger side wheel and counterclockwise for the driv-er's side wheel or maybe I have it backwards. The future column could be several pages covering the full history of the engineering designs or as brief as three words: Because it's British. Moral of the story: No matter how bad something seems at the time, there's almost always a Club member willing to help or knows someone who can help.
